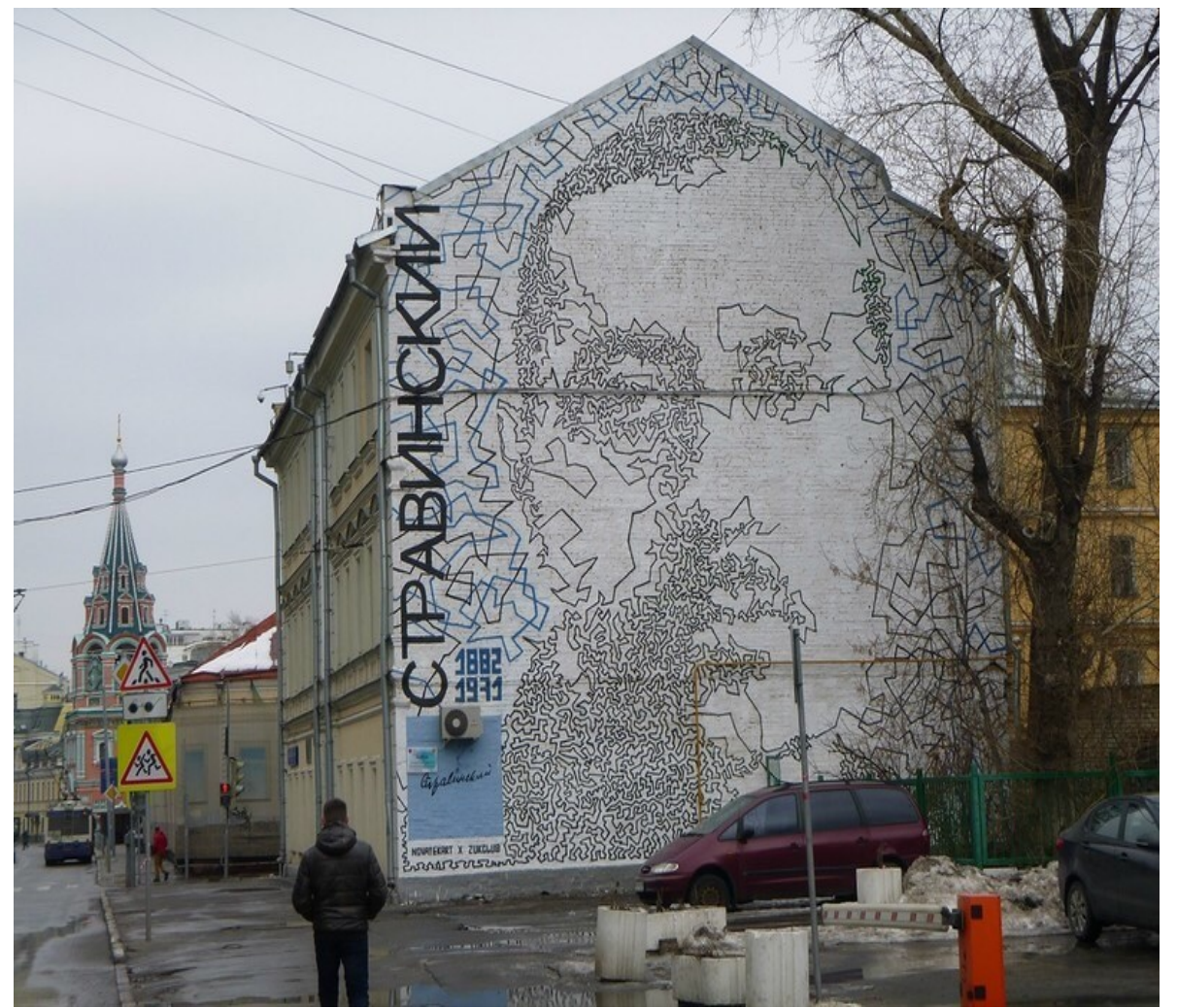

**Moscow.** We can see not only famous sportsmen, pop singers and cultural activists but also heroes of well-known Russian films and cartoons.

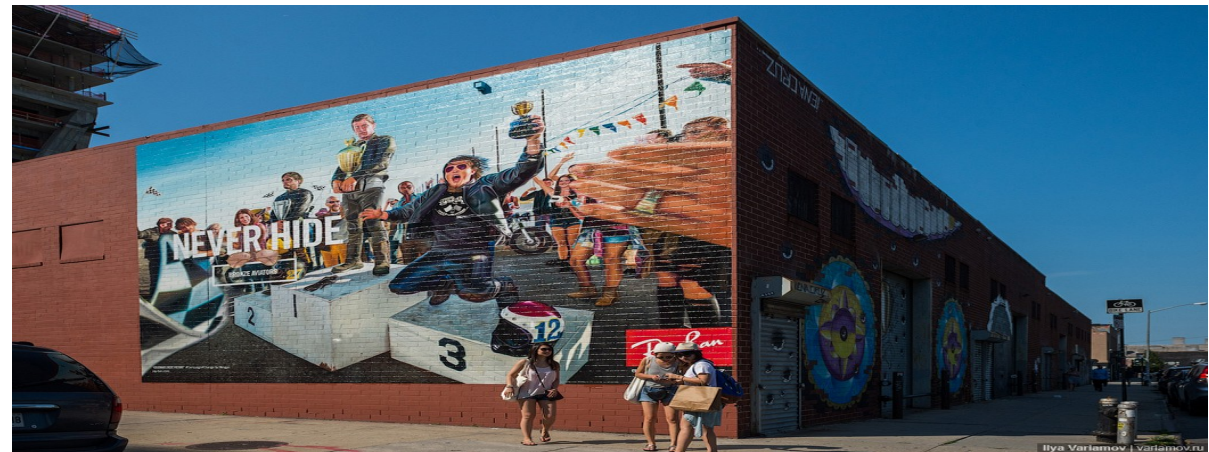

# Bushwick district New-York



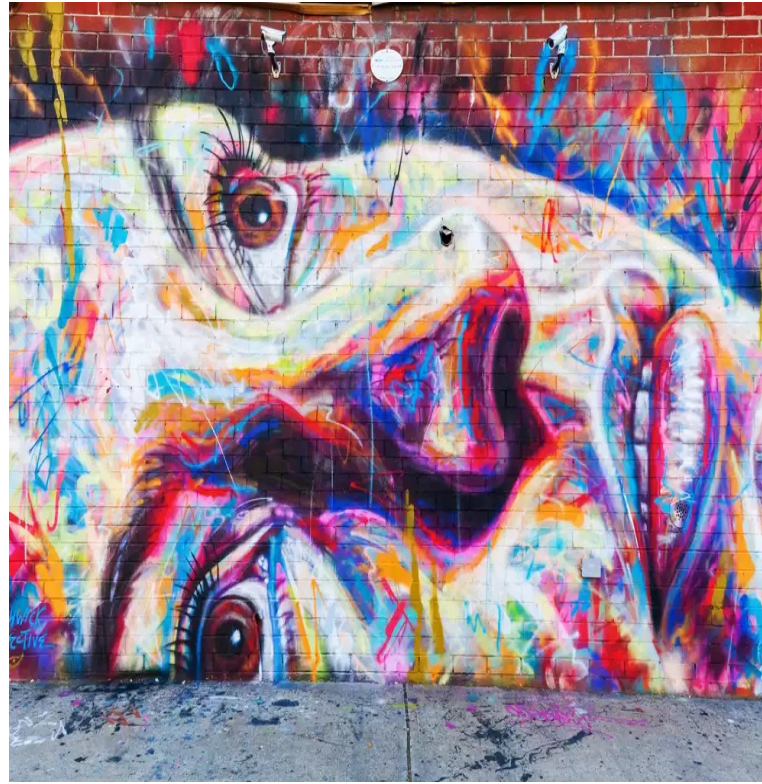

- The work of Chilean artist Dasika Fernandez in Brooklyn. Called "on the rooftop". Fernandez is from the capital of Chile, Santiago, but he lives and works in new York.





- The work of the famous artist James Bullough is called " Beg. Borrow. Steal."
